

Boundary Schools 2017-18 SchoolChoice Priorities

The following information will be used to prioritize applicants for boundary schools during the Round One SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

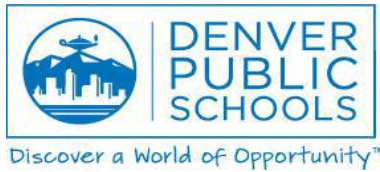
Applicants for ECE are prioritized in the following way (if applicable):

Note: There is no guarantee for ECE enrollment in Denver Public Schools.

1. Students who reside in the school boundary with a currently-attending sibling
2. Students who reside in the school boundary and are currently attending the school's ECE program
3. Students who reside in the school boundary
4. District resident students with a currently-attending sibling
5. Children of full-time employees at the school
6. District resident students who are currently attending the school's ECE program
7. All other District resident students
8. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school's ECE program or have a currently-attending sibling
9. All other non-District resident students

Applicants for Kindergarten are prioritized in the following way:

1. Students who reside in the school boundary (guaranteed)
2. District resident students with a currently-attending sibling
3. Children of full-time employees at the school
4. District resident students who are currently attending the school's 4-year-old ECE program
5. All other District resident students
6. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school's 4-year-old ECE program or have a currently-attending sibling
7. All other non-District resident students



Applicants for grades 1 – 5 are prioritized in the following way:

1. Students who reside in the school boundary (guaranteed)
2. District resident students who are currently attending the school
3. Students eligible for the Gifted Magnet program who reside in the Gifted Magnet feeder school zone with a currently-attending sibling (see chart below)
4. Students eligible for the Gifted Magnet program who reside in the District with a currently-attending sibling
5. Students eligible for the Gifted Magnet program who reside in the Gifted Magnet feeder school zone (see chart below)
6. District resident students with a currently-attending sibling
7. Children of full-time employees at the school
8. Students eligible for the Gifted Magnet program who reside in the District
9. All other District resident students
10. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school or have a currently-attending sibling
11. All other non-District resident students
