

Enrollment Zone Schools 2017-18 SchoolChoice Priorities

The following information will be used to prioritize applicants for enrollment zone schools during the Round One SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

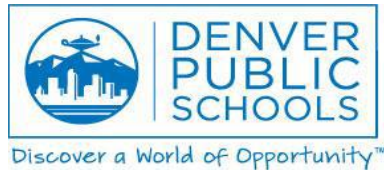
Applicants for ECE or Kindergarten are prioritized in the following way:

Note: There is no guarantee for ECE enrollment in Denver Public Schools.

1. Students residing in the enrollment zone with a currently-attending sibling
2. Students residing in the enrollment zone who are currently attending the school's ECE program
3. Children of full-time employees at the school

25% of the remaining seats are reserved for students who reside in the school's proximity zone. If there are not enough applicants to fill these seats, the seats will be made available to general lottery applicants. If there are more proximity zone resident applicants than available seats, those applicants will be considered for the remaining 75% of general lottery seats, with the following priorities.

1. Students residing in the enrollment zone
2. Students residing in the Greater Park Hill/Stapleton (GPHS) middle school shared boundary **and** have a currently-attending sibling
3. Students residing in the GPHS middle school shared boundary who are currently attending the school's ECE program
4. Students residing in the GPHS middle school shared boundary who qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch (FRL)
5. Students residing in the GPHS middle school shared boundary
6. District resident students with a currently attending sibling
7. District resident students who are currently attending the school's ECE program
8. All other District resident students
9. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school's ECE program **or** have a currently attending sibling
10. All other non-District resident students



Applicants for grades 1 – 5 are prioritized in the following way:

1. Children of the school’s founding or board members, if applicable, or full-time employees of the school
2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a currently-attending sibling
3. Students who reside in the school’s proximity zone, if applicable
4. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
5. District resident students with a currently-attending sibling
6. District resident students who are currently attending the school
7. All other District resident students
8. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school **or** have a currently-attending sibling
9. All other non-District resident students

Denver Public Schools makes every attempt to accommodate siblings who apply together in the same school year. A separate SchoolChoice form must be submitted for each sibling to be considered.
