

Inspire Elementary 2019-20 SchoolChoice Priorities Enrollment Zone Schools

The following information will be used to prioritize applicants during the SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

Applicants for ECE are prioritized in the following way (if applicable):

Note: There is no quarantee for ECE enrollment in Denver Public Schools.

- 1. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a sibling admitted at the school
- 2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone and are currently attending the school's ECE program
- 3. Children of a full-time employee of the school
- 4. Students who reside in the enrollment zone and qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- Students who reside in the school's proximity zone**
- 6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone**
- 7. Greater Park Hill/Stapleton resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- 8. Greater Park Hill/Stapleton resident students currently attending the school
- Greater park Hill/Stapleton resident students that qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- 10. Greater Park Hill/Stapleton resident students
- 11. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- 12. District resident students who are currently attending the school
- 13. All other District resident students
- 14. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school
- 15. Non-District residents who have a sibling admitted at the school
- 16. All other non-District resident students

Applicants for Kindergarten are prioritized in the following way:

- 1. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a sibling admitted at the school
- 2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone and are currently attending the school
- 3. Children of full-time employees at the school



- 4. Students who reside in the district and qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch program*
- 5. Students who reside in the school's proximity zone**
- 6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone**
- 7. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and have a sibling admitted at the school
- 8. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and are currently attending the school
- 9. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- 10. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton
- 11. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- 12. District resident students who are currently attending the school
- 13. All other District resident students
- 14. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school
- 15. Non-District resident students who have a sibling admitted at the school
- 16. All other non-District resident students

** ECE and Kinder: During Round 1, 25% of available seats (after siblings, currently attending students, and children of FTEs are placed) are for proximity zone students. The remaining 75% of available seats are for the entire enrollment zone.

Applicants for grades 1-4 are prioritized in the following way:

- 1. Children of full-time employees of the school
- 2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a sibling admitted at the school
- 3. Students who reside in the school's proximity zone
- 4. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
- 5. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and have a sibling admitted at the school
- 6. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and are currently attending the school
- 7. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- 8. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton
- 9. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- 10. District resident students currently attending the school
- 11. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions



- 12. All other District resident students
- 13. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school
- 14. Non-District resident students that have a sibling admitted at the school
- 15. All other non-District resident students

Denver Public Schools makes every attempt to accommodate siblings who apply together in the same school year. A separate SchoolChoice application must be submitted for each sibling to be considered.
