

KIPP Northeast Denver Middle School 2019-20 SchoolChoice Priorities Enrollment Zone School

The following information will be used to prioritize applicants during the SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

Applicants for grade 5 are prioritized in the following way:

- District or non-District resident students who are currently attending any KIPP school in DPS
- 2. District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at any KIPP school in DPS
- 4. District resident students that qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- 5. Children of full-time employees at the school
- 6. Students who live in the KIPP NE proximity zone
- 7. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
- 8. Students who reside in 80239
- 9. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
- 10. All other District resident students
- 11. All other non-District resident students

Applicants for grades 6-8 are prioritized in the following way:

- District or non-District resident students who are currently attending any KIPP school in DPS
- 2. District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at any KIPP school in DPS
- 4. District resident students that qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- Children of full-time employees at the school
- 6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
- 7. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions



- 8. All other District resident students
- 9. All other non-District resident students

Denver Public Schools makes every attempt to accommodate siblings who apply together in the same school year. A separate SchoolChoice application must be submitted for each sibling to be considered.
