4. Students who reside in the enrollment zone where there is a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
5. Students who reside in the school's proximity zone
6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
7. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and have a sibling admitted at the school
8. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and are currently attending the school
9. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton and live where there is a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
10. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Stapleton

*** ECE and Kinder: During Round 1, 25% of available seats (after siblings, currently attending students, and children of FTEs are placed) are for proximity zone students. The remaining 75% of available seats are for the entire enrollment zone.*
