2023-24 SchoolChoice Priorities
Non-Boundary School (K-5)
Enrollment Zone School (6-8)**

The following information will be used to prioritize applicants during the SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

Please note that ECE-4 will not be using the DPS SchoolChoice lottery system this year. All applicants to ECE-4 at this school should apply via the Universal Preschool (UPK) site. All applicants for grades ECE-5 are prioritized in the following way:

1. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
2. Children of employees of the school (recipients of this priority cannot work at multiple schools)
3. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions*
4. All other District resident students
5. Non-District resident students who have a sibling admitted at the school
6. Non-District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions*
7. All other non-District resident students

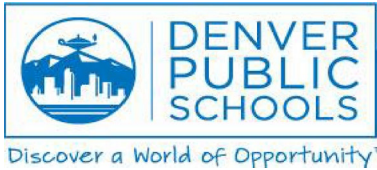
**This admission priority is only applicable to grades 1-5.*

Note: If your student is currently attending Bryant Webster Dual Language ECE, they will automatically be enrolled in Bryant Webster Dual Language for the next school year unless the student participates in the SchoolChoice process and is subsequently accepted to another school.

All applicants for grades 6-8 are prioritized in the following way:

Note: No particular type of applicant is guaranteed admission.

1. Children of employees of the school (recipients of this priority cannot work at multiple schools)
2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a sibling admitted at the school
3. Students who reside in the enrollment zone currently impacted by school closure decisions
4. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
5. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
6. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
7. All other District resident students



8. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school or have a sibling admitted at the school
9. Non-District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
10. All other non-District resident students

Denver Public Schools makes every attempt to accommodate siblings who apply together in the same school year. A separate SchoolChoice application must be submitted for each sibling to be considered.
