



KIPP Northeast Denver Middle School 2023-24 SchoolChoice Priorities Enrollment Zone School

The following information will be used to prioritize applicants during the SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

All applicants for grade 5 are prioritized in the following way:

Note: No particular type of applicant is guaranteed admission.

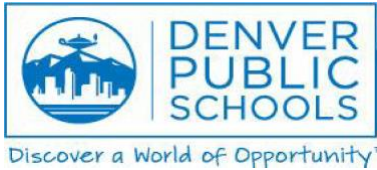
1. District or non-District resident students who are currently attending any KIPP school in DPS
2. District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
3. District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at any KIPP school in DPS
4. Children of employees of the school (recipients of this priority cannot work at multiple schools)
5. Students who reside in the enrollment zone currently impacted by school closure decisions
6. Students who reside in the KIPP NE proximity zone
7. Students who reside in the enrollment zone where there is a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
8. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
9. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
10. District resident students who reside in a geographic area with a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
11. All other District resident students
12. Non-District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
13. All other non-District resident students

Note: If your student is currently attending KIPP Northeast Elementary School, they will automatically be enrolled in KIPP Northeast Denver Middle School for the next school year unless the student participates in the SchoolChoice process and is subsequently accepted to another school.

All applicants for grades 6-8 are prioritized in the following way:

1. District or non-District resident students who are currently attending any KIPP school in DPS
2. District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
3. District or non-District resident students with a sibling admitted at any KIPP school in DPS



4. Children of employees of the school (recipients of this priority cannot work at multiple schools)
5. Students who reside in the enrollment zone currently impacted by school closure decisions
6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone where there is a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
7. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
8. District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
9. District resident students who reside in a geographic area with a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
10. All other District resident students
11. Non-District resident students currently impacted by school closure decisions
12. All other non-District resident students

Denver Public Schools makes every attempt to accommodate siblings who apply together in the same school year. A separate SchoolChoice application must be submitted for each sibling to be considered.
