The following information will be used to prioritize applicants during the SchoolChoice student assignment process, as approved by the DPS Board of Education.

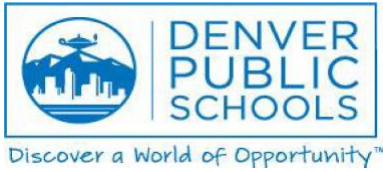

All applicants for grade ECE-3 are prioritized in the following way:

1. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a sibling admitted at the school
2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone and are currently attending the school
3. Children of employees of the school (recipients of this priority cannot work at multiple schools)
4. Students who reside in the enrollment zone where there is a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
5. Students who reside in the school's proximity zone**
6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone **
7. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Central Park and have a sibling admitted at the school
8. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Central Park and are currently attending the school
9. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Central Park and live where there is a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
10. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Central Park
11. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
12. District resident students who are currently attending the school
13. District resident students who reside in a geographic area with a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
14. All other District resident students
15. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school
16. Non-District resident students who have a sibling admitted at the school
17. All other non-District resident students

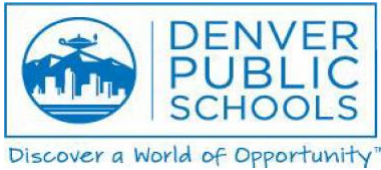

2. Students who reside in the enrollment zone with a sibling admitted at the school
3. Students who reside in a geographic area within the proximity zone with a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
4. Students who reside in the school's proximity zone
5. Students who reside in a geographic area within the enrollment zone that has a high concentration of students eligible for free and reduced price lunch
6. Students who reside in the enrollment zone and are impacted by school closure decisions



7. Students who reside in the enrollment zone
8. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
9. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Central Park and have a sibling admitted at the school
10. Students who reside in Greater Park Hill/Central Park and are currently attending the school
